INTERVENTION MAP: WHEN DO YOU NEED IT?

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Depending on the anticipatory action approach, you may already know where to act once the trigger is reached, but in other cases, this is not yet clear. For example, when working with a specific community, you can develop a trigger and an anticipatory action plan tailored to that community. In such cases, an intervention map is not necessary.

For s/EAPs, however, the situation is different. They usually cover a larger geographic area, and the intervention area is not defined in advance. Only once the forecast is available does it become clear which communities are likely to be affected. This information is then often combined with vulnerability data to prioritise the communities expected to face the greatest impact.
